Title: Chanakya in You

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

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Radha Krishna Pillai is an illusionary writer, awakens the readers with his wonderful thoughts. His books are full of wisdom, flow continues like gush of water. His famous books are corporate Chanakya, Chanakya in you.

Chanakya In You contains 60 chapters. Each chapter is a diamond, treasure of knowledge. It narrates the importance of books, reading habit, how this habit helps and enhances reading skills.

First chapter portrays grandpa and grandson relationship. Every grand son waits eagerly for vacation to spend with grandparents. Role of human relations and importance of grandpa is mentioned. Grandpa advises his grandson to read books, listening stories brings change in life. Grandson discovers Ramayana, Mahabaratha and the Upanishads. Grandson learns Kautilya's Arthasastra is his favorite book.

In the following chapters, author highlights Kautilya's diplomatic actions, promoting Chandra Gupta Maurya, Arthasastra's influence on society and speaks about practical advice and sound commonsense book. It emphasizes strategic management called, Aanvikshi. Chanakya advises his students to apply strategic thinking and planning in the war and Transformation of Chaturanga game into chess.

In the sixth chapter, Leadership qualities, Dharma, righteousness, Dharma Sankat are mentioned. Grandpa advises his grand son to read Bhagavad Gita, then focus on Arthasastra. Here Arjuna's Dharma Sankat of Vishada yoga and Krishna's preaching is narrated.
